Members' Observations:

Peter Waycik reported that he has found 7 species of butterflies were throughout the area to date.

Redhead ducks were seen on the Cataragui River.

Steve Manders gave an update on his overwintering crow project, and reported on a pair of Mallard Ducks that have been sighted in the same spot since 2011, as well as visits to his backyard by raccoons, a skunk and a white footed mouse. Also reported was a nesting Bald Eagle at Devil Lake.

Ken Edwards noted that at the Martin Edwards Reserve on Amherst Island there are several holes in the dyke made by muskrats, one of the holes is occupied by a mink.

Anthony Kaduck shared that there are reports that a Neotropic Cororant has been seen near the Inner Harbour Marina.

Minutes. A motion was made by Larry McCurdy to accept the 2022 Annual General Meeting Minutes, seconded by Bruce Elliott: carried.

President's Report. John Donihee gave a report on the current status of the KFN and a recap of events and accomplishments over the past year. Included in his recap John reported that the KFN is in a good state financially, membership numbers are good, mention of the upcoming Bio Blitz in June, the ongoing program for Juniors and Teens, issues dealt with by the Conservation Committee, the work being done to update the Constitution and Bylaws, and that the Annual May Dinner will resume this year.
